Dear Magical Parents,

Welcome back to the summer term of the 2020/2021 academic year. We hope that you had an enjoyable and restful Easter holiday. It is hard to believe that we are in the last term of the academic year already but we at Magical Meare have planned for it to be filled with wonderful learning opportunities for our marvellous Hooman Beans.

This term, our whole school learning quest has a geographical theme and is entitled 'Magical Maps and Mayhem'. Pyxis and Pegasus children will be naming and locating places in the local community and area while Draconis and Centaurus will be investigating an increasing range of places in their community, the UK and the wider world. All of the children will be developing and expanding their geographical vocabulary by learning to identify human and physical features and patterns, while the KS2 children expand their understanding of the links between people, places and environments.

As always, if you have any books or resources which you feel will support your child's learning and are happy for them to bring these into school to share, it would be very much appreciated. Please ensure that any items are clearly marked with your child's name. Equally, if you feel you have any knowledge or skills that would link to our current learning quest, and you feel you would like to share them, please do get in touch with your child's class teacher.

To support your child with their learning at home, we would strongly advise you to listen to them read, and likewise, read to them on a regular basis; continue to use the online learning support tools e.g. Numbots and TT Rockstars and to engage with Class Dojo so that you are aware of what your child has been learning in school. In addition, it would benefit your child if you could help them with learning to tell the time and identify and use money. **Please note that Class Dojo is solely used for praise and celebration. Should you have any concerns or queries regarding your child's wellbeing, please could these be shared directly with your child's class teacher who will be more than willing to help.**
