World Book Day

Thursday 5 March is World Book Day and we'd like to invite your children to join in with the celebrations. This year, instead of dressing-up as a favourite book character, we plan to do things a little differently!

First of all, we plan to create a 'book in a jar' gallery for all children (and their parents) to share on the day. Every child should, during the week before the 5 March, bring in a glass jar which has something or some things inside that represents a favourite book. It's easier to see than to explain, so here is an example of what a book jar might look like:



We intended to make a trail of these jars, made at home, throughout the school and - at the end of the day - invite you in to see them too!

During the day we will be regularly 'dropping everything to read' and so we also invite your children to come to school in their own, comfy clothes and to bring their slippers, a teddy and maybe even a blanket so that when we do 'drop everything to read' the children will be comfortable and snugly ready for their stories! We ask that they also bring in a mug or cup for some cockles-of-the-heart-warming hot (warm!) chocolate!
